International Fans travelling to the UK

All international ticket holders aged 11 or older must present proof of a negative Lateral Flow Test (LFT), reported and demonstrated via a text message or email to be allowed entry to the 149th Open Championship.

The test (free of charge) needs to be taken within 48 hours of the time gates open. All tests will be self-administered and the result of the Lateral Flow Test must be uploaded using the NHS self-report tool: https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result

Report a COVID-19 rapid lateral flow test result

Use this service to report your result to the NHS after using a rapid lateral flow test kit to check if you're infectious with coronavirus (COVID-19).

A rapid lateral flow test is a coronavirus test you do yourself. It shows you the result on a handheld device that comes with the test.

Report the result:

- every time you use a rapid lateral flow test kit
- as soon as possible after you get the result

You cannot report a result after more than 24 hours.

You can only report one result at a time.




