#### **International Fans travelling to the UK**

All international ticket holders aged 11 or older must present proof of a negative Lateral Flow Test (LFT), reported and demonstrated via a text message or email to be allowed entry to the 149<sup>th</sup> Open Championship.

The test (free of charge) needs to be taken within 48 hours of the time gates open. All tests will be self-administered and the result of the Lateral Flow Test must be uploaded using the NHS self-report tool:

# Report a COVID-19 rapid lateral flow test result

Use this service to report your result to the NHS after using a rapid lateral flow test kit to check if you're infectious with coronavirus (COVID-19).

A rapid lateral flow test is a coronavirus test you do yourself. It shows you the result on a handheld device that comes with the test.

Report the result:

- every time you use a rapid lateral flow test kit
- as soon as possible after you get the result

You cannot report a result after more than 24 hours.

You can only report one result at a time.
